I would not be doing my job if I did not remind everyone that while ozone action day measures are appropriate year-long, they have been instrumental in helping the Baton Rouge area achieve and stay in attainment. With a final decision on the reconsidered ozone standard due out from EPA in August, all of the metro areas of the state are potentially subject to a determination of nonattainment. Establishment of clean

air coalitions in each of these areas is a critical step in the implementation of local emission reduction measures. If asked to serve on one of these coalitions in your community, I encourage you to step up to that challenge.

Louisiana Section Requests Nominations

In 2001, the Louisiana Section of the Air & Waste Management Association established an annual award to recognize outstanding achievement in the fields of air pollution control or waste management.

The Section has been pleased with the high quality of projects nominated for the award in previous years, and we are now requesting nominations for the award in 2010. Air pollution technical achievements may include: specific processes which minimize or more effectively control air pollution; new air pollution equipment; and improved management practices which reduce air pollution or examine its impacts (i.e., sophisticated models). Material/waste engineering projects may include: production process changes that minimize by-product formation; processes for recycling/reuse of by-products and/or waste; applied novel techniques for destroying waste; and overall improved systems for waste disposal. The 2010 award recipient will be a company or individual whose contribution to the state of the art technology has been accomplished within the last two years.

Please submit the name of the company or individual being nominated, plus a short description of the project or achievement. Submittals should not exceed ten pages (including text, figures, calculations, photographs, etc.) and should be sent to the following address:


