The Issue of Proximity Environmental Justice

 We share EPA's vision of environmental equity: "the fair treatment and meaningful involvement of all people regardless of race, color, national origin, or income, with respect to the development, implementation, and enforcement of environmental laws, regulations, and policies."



The Issue of Proximity Environmental Justice

- When a community is adjacent to a plant, the plant has an obligation to be a good corporate neighbor.
- Plant officials should ask themselves, "What can I do as a plant to enhance the quality of life of the surrounding community?



Outreach

The most effective tactic is to ask the residents themselves. If a plant manager doesn't have a citizen's advisory group, he is not doing his job.



Buyouts

- One solution to plants locating close to communities is for the company to buy out residents in areas adjacent to or near the plant fence line.
- Buyout terms can be generous with 150 percent or more of market value being offered for homes in buffer zones.



Buyout drawbacks

- Even with a purchase price above fair market value, homeowners may find the offer is not enough for replacement value in nearby relocation sites.
- The community will disappear. Family homes will be lost, and cemeteries and historic sites that wind up being company property may no longer be open for public access.
