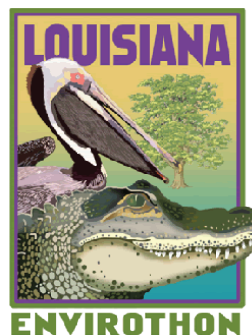
I would like to encourage each member of the Louisiana Section to consider offering their talents to a team of high school or junior high students. Encourage those young people to attend the training sessions, use the study resources and compete

as a team on May 5, 2007, in the Louisiana Envirothon 2007. Having worked with teams participating in the past, I assure you, it will be a most fulfilling experience in professional and intellectual growth for the adults and the team members.

The Louisiana Envirothon welcomes high school and junior high teams of five students to train and compete in aquatics, wildlife, forestry, soils and a current issue. This year's current issue is alternative and renewable energy. Teams also make an oral presentation as a part of the competition. The high school team winning the Louisiana event may go to the North American event sponsored by Canon. This year the NA event will be at Hobart & William Smith Colleges in New York.

Training events are offered prior to the Louisiana event. They are usually held on a Saturday and every attempt is made to hold them in the geographical area of the registered teams. All young people are welcome to participate in the training events, whether they will be competing or not.

The event has been hosted and sponsored by the



Alcoa Foundation, Environmental Ed Commission, ULL, LDWF, LDAF, LDEQ, LA Cooperative Extension Service, and LEHA.

Louisiana Section members can participate as advisors, building teams from schools, home schools, churches, Scout troops, 4H groups, FFA groups, environmental clubs or similar. They can offer their services as trainers, coaches, or intellectual resources.

ADOPT-A-SCHOOL PROGRAM

The primary purpose of the Louisiana Section Adopt-A-School program is to select an elementary school at which the Section will award a cash donation for use at the 5th or 6th grade level in the area of science education.

It is the Louisiana Section's desire that the funds be allocated to a specific project or purpose rather than simply becoming assimilated into the school's general fund. In addition to the cash donation, the Louisiana Section also endeavors to assist the school in its program for the year by providing speakers and arranging other educational offerings throughout the section year.

Ideally, but not a requirement, a Louisiana Section member nominating a school

should be involved with the school and would be expected to act as liaison between the association and the school in the presentation of the award and any additional activities scheduled for the school during the year.

Recipients of the grant will be requested to attend a Louisiana Section dinner meeting in New Orleans in January to receive the funds. Proposals should be received no later than 5pm December 15, 2006.
