Regulatory Goals for Enforcement

- To assess penalties in a consistent, fair, and equitable manner
- To assess penalties that are appropriate for the gravity of the violation committed
- To eliminate the economic incentives for non-compliance
- To deter future non-compliance
- To achieve and maintain compliance



Building a Caseload: Two Methods

File Review Process

- Title V Reports Annual, Semiannual, & Quarterly Deviation Reports
- Specific Condition Reports, Release Notifications, General Condition XI reports, & Self-Reported Violations

Referral Process

- Surveillance Complaints & Inspections
- Air Toxics
- Emission Inventory
- Engineering
- Permits


Circuit Rider Process











Enforcement Actions: Injunctive Relief (continued)

- CO: Compliance Order
 - Cites violations
 - Pursuant to La. R.S. 30:2050.2(B)
 - »must be reasonably specific
 - »must specify a timeframe for compliance
 - »must notify of right to appeal
 - »must advise that penalties are possible
 - May be combined with NOPP (CONOPP)
 - Requires written report
 - Requires Respondent to do something or cease doing something




Enforcement Actions: No Injunctive Relief (continued)

- NOPP: Notice of Potential Penalty
 - Cites violations
 - Pursuant to La. R.S. 30:2050.3(B):
 - notifies of possible penalty (after 10 days)
 - must be reasonably specific
 - allows for written comments
 - Cannot be appealed




Enforcement Actions: No Injunctive Relief

- XP: Expedited Penalty Agreement
 - Cites minor violations with predetermined penalty amounts
 - Injunctive Relief NO
 Its voluntary. Otherwise NOPP
 - pay fine
 - must correct violations
 - cannot be appealed



Enforcement Actions: No Injunctive Relief


- NOCV: Notice of Corrected Violation
 - Cites minor violations
 - States violations have been corrected
 - cannot be appealed
- NOV: Notice of Violation
 - Cites minor violations
 - cannot be appealed



Formal Enforcement Process

Enforcement Actions: Injunctive Relief (continued)

- PA: Penalty Assessment
 - Cites violations
 - Pursuant to La. R.S. 30:2050.3(C)(2)
 - -must be reasonably specific
 - -must indicate the amount of the penalty
 - -must notify of right to appeal
 - Must assess against factors outlined in La. R.S. 30:2025 (E) and LAC 33:I.Chapter 7




Injunctive Relief

An order that forbids a person or company from doing something, or orders them to take certain action....

Examples:

- Submit Title V Reports
- Pay a fine
- Install control equipment
- Comply with interim limits

Settlement Process

Enforcement Actions: Injunctive Relief (continued)


- SA: Settlement Agreement
 - Cites violations
 - Must assess against factors outlined in La. R.S. 30:2025 (E) (no requirement for Chapter 7)
 - Requires Respondent to do something or cease doing something
 - Must be public noticed
 - Must get AG concurrence
 - May hold public hearing



Appeals

- •Respondent has 30 days from receipt to appeal.
- Appeal requests must be specific
- •If appeal is requested, the Secretary has 30 days to grant or deny appeal.
- •Both Respondent and Department may elect for informal dispute resolution. During informal dispute resolution, the 30 day requirement to grant or deny is postponed for up to 1 year.
- •Only COs, CONOPPs, and Penalty Assessments can be appealed.
- •If action is not appealed and compliance is not achieved during the prescribed timeframe, Enforcement may petition to make the action Executory.
