

Second Place: "Recycle Content vs. Ring Crush",



Scholarship Program Awards

Each year, the Air & Waste Management Association is pleased to offer its Scholarship Award Program at the collegiate level, promoting air and waste management practices by encouraging academic excellence in these areas. Letters requesting applicants for the scholarship award were sent to universities in the geographical region of the section, and applications for the scholarship award program have been received.

We are proud to announce the winners of this year's awards. They were chosen by the selection committee based on their interest

statements, resumes, GPA and interviews which demonstrated their dedication to environmental issues.

Our annual first place, Gus vonBodungen award, in the amount of \$3,000, went to Ms. Heather Owens at Louisiana State University.

Adopt-A-School Program

The primary purpose of the Louisiana Section Adopt-A-School program is to select an elementary school at which the Section will award a cash donation for use at the 5th, 6th, 7th or 8th grade level in the area of science education. It is the Louisiana Section's desire that the funds be allocated to a specific project or purpose rather than simply becoming assimilated into the school's general fund.

In addition to the cash donation, the Louisiana Section also endeavors to assist the school in its program for the year by providing speakers and arranging other educational offerings throughout the section year.

No specific form for the proposal is required. The proposals will be evaluated equally on need and quality of the proposed program.

The Louisiana Section requests that, at a minimum, the following information be provided regarding the school being nominated:

- 1. General background information about the school, including: the number of students in school and in the 5th/6th /7th/8th grades; the demographics of student population.
- 2. The significance the cash donation would have in the school's overall program of science education, specifically: a clear explanation of why the school needs the grant, and the total number of students who will benefit from the grant.
- 3. Specific information regarding the intended use for the funds and the need for teacher training in the environmental sciences.

The more project-oriented

grant requests tend to score higher points with the judges than simple grant requests for money for the school's general science funding.

Ideally, but not a requirement, a Louisiana Section member nominating a school should be involved with the school and would be expected to act as liaison between the association and the school in the presentation of the award and any additional activities scheduled for the school during the year.

Recipients of the grant will be requested to attend a Louisiana Section dinner meeting in New Orleans in January to receive the funds. Attendance is encouraged, but not required. Details will be provided at a later date.

Outstanding Achievement Award - Louisiana Section Honors 2006 and 2007 Award Winners

In 2001, the Louisiana Section of the Air & Waste Management Association established an annual award to recognize outstanding achievement in the fields of air pollution control or waste management. The award recipient is a company or individual whose contribution to the state of the art technology has been accomplished within the last two years.

Due to Hurricane Katrina, the Section did not select an award winner in 2006, for the year 2005. Therefore, this year, we selected two award winners, one for a project implemented in the year 2005, and the other for a project implemented in the year 2006.


The Section has been pleased with the high quality of projects nominated for the award in previous years, and the years 2005 and 2006 were no exception. The winner for the year 2006 was the East Baton Rouge City-Parish DPW Environmental Division. The title of the winning project was "Hurricane Woody Debris Converted Into Boiler Fuel." The goal of the project was to mulch or chip the woody debris from Hurricanes Katrina and Rita and to use the resulting chips as boiler fuel for local industry. By exerting extra effort to process the debris through a chipper instead of burning or landfilling it, the City-Parish was able to create a source of income, benefit the environment, save landfill airspace, and provide a cost-effective source of fuel for local industry. Approximately 550,000 cubic yards of debris were handled in this manner as a result of this project.




