

March Dinner Meeting Wrap Up

The March dinner meeting was held at Drusilla Place Catering. The speaker was Dr. Christopher Kuhlman, Project Toxicologist with CTEH. Dr. Kuhlman spoke on "Clearing the Air: Toxicology and Exposure Guidelines for Benzene and Ethylene Oxide". He began with an overview of the principles of toxicology and then discussed the toxic properties of both benzene and ethylene oxide. He also reviewed the current exposure guidelines and standards for each chemical and when it is appropriate to use each. For example, the standard used in an industrial setting is different from the standard used for ambient air that the general population is exposed to. He discussed the concept of "acceptable risk" and the EPA's use of the term in developing community exposure guidelines. We appreciate Dr. Kuhlman taking time out of his busy schedule to speak to us; he was headed next to assist in evaluating the impacts from the tank farm fire in Houston!
